


Tadao Ando's He Museum: From Looks to Prevalence Eliana Xie

Tadao Ando is a 82-years-old Japanese architect born in Osaka. His style can be described as simplistic and minimal. To me, his widely used primary materials such as concrete, stone, or glass, can lean toward contemporary brutalism. One of his most recent projects: He Museum has demonstrated such, it is a heavily Ando-styled structure with floor-to-ceiling glazings and wide windows. The building is 172,000-square-foot in usable area and resides next to an artificial pond. With shifted-floor plates acting as a form of deconstructivism, Ando's versatility is terrifically displayed from this project.
